



Dumpers are used for works like carrying sand graver, stones etc. to the places where major works are undertaken by contractors engaged in construction of road, National highways etc. Presently the activities of the quarry sites are closed as the same have not been so far permitted by the forest department and no major works of dumpers are noticed. Presently in Baksa district the works in the National highways are going on Barama center, Barama to Nikashi state highway, Tamulpur Motonga to Udalguri state highway, Bhabanipur to Bashbari state highway. But the contractors engaged in these major works are using dumpers, registered in India. No dumpers of Bhutan are found to be hired by the public for commercial purpose in Baksa. The report published in the Assam Tribune is a story build by far fetched imagination. At present the stone and gravels mahals (Quarries) are closed and even the local dumpers are lying unutilized. The News item that the state government is losing corers of Revenue due to hiring of dumpers belonging to Bhutan is not based on fact. However all O/Cs and I/Cs of PSs, P.O.s/PPs of Baksa district are directed to keep strict vigil regarding hiring of vehicles of Bhutan for commercial purpose illegally and to take prompt action by handing over he same for necessary action if such vehicles detected.
